It was a pleasant evening as the students of Advanced Zoology made their way into West Namachivayapuram, a humble settlement adjacent to Coovum River, a 10 minutes' walk from Loyola College. The day was marked for Independence day celebrations, involving all the children from the area in various cultural activities.

The preparations had well begun weeks earlier. The idea and vision of the event was projected to us by Mr. J. Antony Anbarasan , Asst. Professor - Dept Of Service Learning.

The event planning took care of three things –

1. Enrollment
2. Cultural activities
3. Prize distribution

Around twelve students in four groups of three, were sent to their allocated areas and asked to inform people about the event and register the names of children interested. To fasten the process, students referred to the regional census , they took earlier to narrow down on houses with kids. On knowing about the event, many children were keen as well as many were initially shy and reluctant to participate in anything. It took some friendly banter, and some inspirational ‘ no losers-no winners’ like talk to get them involved . A total of 43- 46 children’s names were registered. They come from various parts of the age spectrum, from a child studying at class I to a boy in high school.

Now that the registration was done, the next phase was setting up an area for the event. This proved to be difficult as we needed an area within the locality, so that children could be easily directed and can be facilitated to put up a good show for the locales . The problem did not persist as we expected, thanks to the timely intervention of Mr. Parthiban who was very

helpful in clearing up an area for a stage and setting up the necessary sound systems.



Several cultural activities were decided upon –

1. Drawing competition
2. Singing Competition (patriotic songs)
3. English and Tamil elocution (Topic : India)



. With a lot of effort, students tidied up the place and decorated it with crimped ribbons. Half an hour before the event, the children whose names were registered were called upon and led to the clearance .They were seated as the sound systems were checked .The role of

11. Dengue awareness rally

The students of b.com b section have conducted the **dengue awareness rally** in S.S. Puram in Teynampet Chennai. Due to the rainy season in slum areas many of the people has affected by fevers so we take the initiative to conduct the program on 29th September 2016 our class students have together gone for a rally in the area. We had made placards and pamphlets to do the program in a good manner .we done many rally for around 3-4 streets. Our faculty Prof.Baskar Jayabalan sir has inaugurated the rally.

Dengue fever: is a mosquito-borne tropical disease caused by the dengue virus symptoms typically begin three to fourteen days after infection. This may include a high fever, headache, vomiting, muscle and joint pains, and a characteristic skin rash. recovery generally takes two to seven days in a small proportion of cases, the disease develops into the life-threatening dengue haemorrhagic fever, resulting in bleeding, low levels of blood platelets and blood plasma leakage, or into dengue shock syndrome, where dangerously low blood pressure occurs.

Dengue is spread by several species of mosquito of the *aedes* type, principally *a. aegypti*. The virus has five different types; infection with one types that type, but only short-term immunity to the others. Subsequent infection with a different type increases the risk of severe complications; a number of tests are available to confirm the diagnosis including detecting

Impact of the program:

by conducting the program people in that area are well aware about the dengue

disease and they now knew how to use the clean the vessels ,and they are aware about drinking boiled water and to keep their surroundings and drainages clean. Our students have given the pap lets to the people to be aware about it and we mentioned how to be aware about it.By doing these kind of rallies we learn lot of social services and happy to serve to the peoples.



12. Awareness on Schemes available for Differently abled

The event was organized by the Differently able groups of Sociology & Economics departments this event focused to bring out the differently able peoples of Anju kudasai, Amma nagar & NN colony slums build a rapport among the differently able people. 21. Physiotherapy treatment at Avvaipuram

No of Students participated-50

The medical camp was organized by an NGO “Help Age India” and the students of Tamil department. The camp took place for five days from 24th January to 29th January 2017. The camp started at 10 AM and it went on until 3 PM. The students of Tamil Department were involved in registering the names of the people who had come for the camp. Dr. Anitha, Physiotherapist from Help Age India, was treating the patients who had come to the camp. The majority of the people who came to the camp were having knee and joint pains apart from having pain in the shoulders and different parts of the body. The Physiotherapist was administering



Interferential therapy (IFT,) which delivers a continuous stimulation deep into the affected tissue. The stimulation both blocks pain and reduce swelling and inflammation which can cause pain.” On an average 20 people were treated for a day and most of them were above 45 to 50 years of age. The therapy and the exercises suggested by the Physiotherapist benefitted

the slum dwellers of R. K. Nagar in at least reducing to a certain extent the body pain which they have been enduring for many years and a few people said that the therapy has had a definite impact on their body.

The cyclone vardha has put two states Tamilnadu on the edge by throwing life out of gear on the coastal areas of the states. as per the latest report, the Indian meteorological department said that the cyclone vardah is expected to make a landfall between 2 pm to 5 pm. The rescue operations started from the past 48 hours and the current wind speed is 110 to 130 kmph and expected to reach 150 kmph when vardah hits Tamil Nadu. Navy, army all are ready to meet any crisis.

Conclusion:

by doing these kind of activities we understood how the standard of living of the people and how these people suffering for their basic needs.

This programme includes the theme of reaching out the people (i.e.) people residing in and around the slums with a group of youngsters.

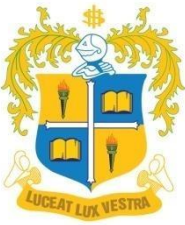

Awareness of government schemes

No of students who have participated in this program: 17

The students of the Statistics Department had done an awareness program about the various welfare schemes of the government which are catering to women on 14th February 2017. The welfare schemes are about free education, the financial assistance which young women can receive for their marriage, the financial assistance for taking care of the needs of female children (one or two children if they are twins) from poor families, the financial assistance for marriage given to children of widows, the financial assistance for remarriage of widows, the financial assistance for marriage intended for poor women, the financial assistance given to women for inter caste marriages, the educational assistance given for children of widows as well as scholarship for children.

The students came to know about these welfare schemes through the welfare officer in Tamil Nadu District Social Welfare board. They have also restricted the annual income for a year to Rs. 72000 or Rs. 48000 and in some cases to even Rs.24000 to make it ineligible for some people to make use of these schemes. Background

West Namachivayapuram, the area assigned to The Department of Adv.Zoology for the outreach program, has a sizeable population of young people in their teens. There is no shortage of talent or determination whatsoever, expect for direction and a general lack of awareness of the opportunities that lay ahead.

Recognising this, the Youth Wing of Adv.Zoology outreach group, through the able support of Mr. Anony Anbarasu (Asst Professor, OutreachDept), decided to conduct a career counseling program for the slum youth, taking into account their aspirations and chalking out a career path for them.

Mobilization And Preparation

The programme was the result of clever planning that began a week before the event. This involved inviting high schoolers, who were the target audience. Rather than going the conventional way of going to various homes, students were split into groups and were stationed at multiple locations – roadways in the area, during the after school hours. The students met a great number of children, who were on their way home, striking up a conversation and informing them about the event.

The students, in charge of counseling had the important task of preparing reliable material for the event. This involved patient browsing and collecting information from various internet sources (trusted websites), and a little of personal experience to connect with the audience.

The Event

The venue for the programme was the Palvadi in the area, which could comfortably seat around 40 children. The event started without any kind of formal obligations, as it was meant to be a one-on one interaction b/w students and the children. Santosh (15-az-041) headed the

programme, he started with a brief introduction on the importance of class X and class XII and the significance of dreaming big.

After the briefing, students addressed each of the students present, asking questions on their academic history, their strengths and weaknesses, their subject of preference and talents besides academics (sports, music). Students elaborated upon their answers, by helping them visualize all the career possibilities in front of them, but also the financial and academic conditions that'd be required to pursue it. They were also informed about the decreasing scope in Engg. Courses, and advised not to get into the quagmire of private engineering colleges. The children in turn inquired about exam-writing strategies, and minimum marks required to get into a good college.

Children were asked to eat healthy and have proper sleep, which could have a positive effect in their retentive memory as well as thinking abilities. A minimum amount of physical activity everyday was also recommended. Special stress was laid on the outreach camp Loyola conducts every year, giving ample support and cutoff relaxation for children from outreach areas. One of the students, Prasanna, a bright student from Adv. Zoology, testified this as he himself is a native of West Namachivaya Nagar, and claimed to have been greatly benefitted from it.

Prof. Antony, who supervised the event, ensured the participation of all students, in some form or other, engaging the students in mobilization, counseling, or just having a talk with the concerned parents.

As the programme came to an end, the conversation b/w students and the children shared more of a friend- friend quotient. The children gained a lot , so did the students, who suddenly realized the value of their education ,which remains a distant dream for many . The students bid goodbye to the children with an open-hearted invitation – ‘Study hard, dream big. You’re the future. You could be Loyalties’.

No of students who have participated in this program: 15

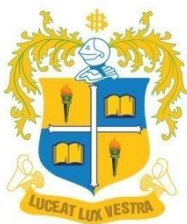

A scheme similar to that of the Prime Ministers scheme, “BETI BACHO BETI PADHAO”

✓ Girl child born before 01-08-2011, will be given 22,200/-

✓ Girl child born after 01-08-2011, will be given 50,000/-

Two baby child:

✓ Girl child born before 01-08-2011, will be given 15,200/- (per head)

✓ Girl child born after 01-08-2011, will be given 25,000/- (per head)

The purpose of the programme is to create awareness on Government welfare schemes for the welfare of the women. This huge programme was carried on by the “Women Empowerment Group” and the rest accompanied them in making this programme successful.
