9. NILAVAMBU KASAYAM DISTRIBUTION Number of participants: 54

The Students belonging to the Department of History (BA Second Year- shift-II students) distributed and explain to the people about the importance of Taking Nilavembu Kasayam, as it is part of their outreach. Before that they taken survey on Dengue fever affected people by last year. According to that they arranged Nilavembu Kasayam to prevention measure.



Nilavembu Kasayam is one of the efficient medicines in fighting against disease causing bacteria and viruses, especially against disease causing organisms which cause Dengue and Malaria. The program was organized on 17-08-2018 in Anna Nagar, Gothamedu. The health and sanitation team members bought the Nilavembu Kasayam powder and gave it to the Amma Unavagam staffs who were working at Saidapet and they prepared the kasayam which was later distributed to the people. Once the Kasayam was prepared it was distributed to the people in the outreach intervention areas. (especially Balwadi Children were drunk Kasayam) Local youth members also join hands with our students to distribute Kasayam. The Nilavembu Kasayam drink was distributed to atleast 200 people in the intervention areas and the people thanked the students for taking such an initiative. Students also very happy to worked as a team to prevent Dengue fever for the slums people.

21. First-aid Demo on Cardiac arrest

Our first aid demo was done on Monday dated (27/08/2018) 9.00 a.m. our topic was first aid for a victim who is suffering from a cardiac arrest. We were three in number representing



health & sanitation team. Later we went on explaining how cardiac attack happens and what are the important immediate measures needed to be taken in order to save a life. We started with a victim falling due to unremitting pain felt in his chest who was immediately first aided by a passerby. The passer by made it clear that he wanted no one to surround the victim so that the victim feels free to respiration and he clearly insisted the to call for a help. He then continued with removing his shirt buttons to still more make him feel free. Later he checked the pulse and the breathing rate once he noticed that the rates were drastically dropping down he went on with CARDIO PULMONARY RESUSCITATION. The passer by placed his hands locked one above the other and pressed the victims

The second year B. Com A section students spoke about Health related information to the Senior citizens of Mullama Nagar on 31st August 2018. They made the elderly people aware about the important aspects related to health things which they to take into consideration. The students were given a handout containing 40 points which was prepared by Dr. V. K. Natarajan. Dr. V. K. Natarajan was a specialist in dealing with senior citizens and he is the recipient of the Padmashree award. They spoke to the senior citizens about the importance of taking medical tests,



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importance of maintaining the prescription chits and noting down the medicines which cause allergies/harm to their bodies, taking medicines without the consent of the doctor(on the advice of the pharmacist), significance of different forms and ways of treating diseases, quantity of food to be consumed at each meal. The students also spoke about the symptoms associated with heart attack, diabetes, thyroid disorders, stroke, Epilepsy, schizophrenia, Dementia Alzheimer's disease. The students made the people understand the importance of moderate physical exercise and the necessity to manage their weight as obesity can cause many diseases. They also made them understand how stress can affect them. The students told the elderly men that frequent smoking and drinking beyond the age of sixty can severely affect their bodies and they told them to meditate and not be too worried about their problems. They also told them that they should start saving some money every month as these days they cannot expect their children or grand children to take care of them when they become too old. The elderly people listened patiently as the students spoke about these facts to almost all of the senior people in Nambikkai Nagar.

28. Awareness programme on carry bag and plastic containers for hot food

Introduction:

A quiz competition was conducted in order to celebrate Teachers Day. As it was our second event we managed to learn from our mistakes and conducted the event in a better way. Our first event was a sports oriented one so we decided to do something more intellect based, which would encourage the children to become more interested to learn new things. We wanted this event to be a precursor to our new method of teaching involving quizzes, facts etc. The event was conducted on 5 th September 2018, in the community hall of Samiyaar Thottam. It was conducted by Education Team for the students of the evening tuition

Preparation:

As it was a quiz competition we had to prepare the questions beforehand, choosing the questions carefully for the students. We informed as many students as possible through the evening tuitions and made them inform others too. We gathered all the students in the hall at 4' O clock.



Actual event in detail:

The quiz consisted of three sections – General Knowledge, Science and Current Affairs; simple enough for the students but at the same time challenging them. We distributed prizes equally among all students to prevent jealousy and ill feeling.

Output of the event:

34. Financial Assistance to the persons with different health issues

Number of participants: 15

Health, Sanitation and Environment team members of BBA.A did a survey in the area. While they were visiting the huts, they came to know that there were three persons who were in need of financial support.

Mrs. Rajeshwari aged 52 is a widow. She is a domestic worker and earns Rs.3000 per month. While she was cleaning the toilet in the house where she works, she fell down and got fractured in the right leg in the 14th July 2018. She went to the hospital and got treated. She was given a slip for the tablets which were unavailable in the hospital. Students met the woman and purchased the tablets twice and gave her 10 kilo grams of rice. She was also given counselling and now she slowly walks after 3 months.



Miss. valli aged 43 is a differently abled and a heart patient. She is a spinster. Her mother is a widow and a domestic worker. She lives in a rented hut. The amount which comes in is not adequate to manage the family. She told that she has to go for heart check - up. She was in need of Rs.7000. Students of Health, Sanitation and Environment team collected Rs.3000 and supported her. She was very grateful for the support received. She also promised that she would use the amount only for the same purpose.

Mr. Senthilkumar aged 25 works as a driver. He met with an accident and got his right hand fractured. He went to the hospital and had PuthurKattu which is very prominent. He came and told the team that he has never approached anyone for untying the bandage. He pleaded to help him with Rs.1500. The team discussed the issue with the staff from the department of Service Learning and finally decided to help him with Rs.800. Prof.K.A.S.Melson told him that he need not repay the amount but he could help someone after the full recovery. All these supports were done on 8th September 2018. 15 students took the initiative in this activity.

35. Community programme on anti-alcoholism at South Boag road

Number of participants: 20

The students of MA History organized a community programme on 14th September 2018 at South Boag road slum. They were placed at South Boag road slum for their urban intervention programme. They visited the locality to know more about the urban poor and their problems. Based on the interaction with community people, they found out some of the social issues. What lacks in that particular locality is that clean and neatness around the surroundings. Even there are many temples located in that particular area and many rituals happen, we could find people not protecting the area in terms of neatness and cleanliness. Government initiatives such as swacha bharath have not been successfully initiated in these places. Literacy rate is moderate in this area. Drunkards are more in this area. Women are self employed by keeping flower stalls and selling food on road, the biggest issue that they are facing is with tarmac which is near to area. Many young people and other aged men are drinking even in the morning times. Surroundings must be more clean unless than they can't avoid certain diseases such a dengue, cholera, asthma. being the heart of the city there are many facilities near the area but all of them are corporate which these slum people cannot afford or approach. Most of the government facilities are reaching the people over there but the things are not happening in the issued g.o. M.K. Radha nagar is an slum colony located near Teynampet, Chennai, Tamilnadu. There was a bridge which was constructed in that particular area built over a waste dump age canal all the stones and construction materials were placed on the road when we went for the



first time but even after a week many waste materials were lying there around. Chennai Corporation must take many more initiatives regarding the neatness of that area. Many walls were stuck with posters which were talking about "sutham sugadhaaram". The young population in this area is very less but the women population was very much high. Women were more in number and every one of them had right to vote and that was the reason for government initiating the programmes in this area on time. as said above women voters are high and still couldn't bring a change in banning the tarmac all around that area. The 2nd year B. A. Economic students created awareness about the communicable diseases which can affect the people during the colder months. The students were divided into different groups to reach out effectively to all the people residing in Mullaima Nagar. The different groups of students were all given a sheet containing the information about different communicable diseases. The information sheet also contained information related to strengthening the immune system so that their immune system could be strengthened to fight against infectious disease causing





organisms. The students spoke about the fact that malnutrition and vitamin deficiencies may increase susceptibility to infection and hence consuming fresh fruits and vegetables and certain other foods is necessary to strengthen the immune system. They told the people that foods such as Spinach, garlic, blueberries, fish, whole wheat, black rice, Onion, ginger, ginger tea, Pepper, squash, orange, lemon, amla, grape fruit, green tea, mushrooms,

Cauliflower and Eggs can strengthen the immune system. They also made them understand that Alcoholism, Obesity, Lack of exercise, Poor hygiene, Smoking, Stress, Worrying, Sun exposure and Excessive use of antiobotics could weaken the immune system. They also spoke about draining the Breeding places or using insecticides to eliminate vec tors of disease and also about the risks associated with walking on infected water and hence they were advised to wash and dry their feet after walking on infected water. They people were advised to follow the recommendation given by WHO with regards to heating the water (water should be Roll boiled before it is fit for drinking) and food must be reheated fully after it is taken from the fridge and it should be Hot as certain organisms can thrive and grow on food which is neither too hot or cold.

The students also instructed the people about the symptoms of communicable diseases like Dengue, Malaria, T.B, swine flu, rat fever and other diseases. They difference in the symptoms associated with each of these diseases and told them to seek medical attention as soon as they had any of these symptoms. They also told them that if many people in an area were affected with a particular disease they could call



142.Report on Nutrition Camp

Number of Participants - 53

The students of B.Com Corporate B- section organized a program on child nutrition, at the Balwadi in Godha medu, saidapet on the 12th of March, 2019. The primary objective of create awareness among the parents about nutrition deficiency and the camp was to malnutrition. Parents, kids and the caretakers of the Balwadi were present for the entire program. The Chief Guests were Dr. Arthi K. K., MBBS, and her sister, Dr, Kirthi K. K., MBBS and they gave their valuable tips, suggestions, and information to parents and the caretakers of Balwadi. The students gave a gift as a small token of gratitude to the doctors. Thirty kids, their parents, and the 5 caretakers of the Balwadi were present during the program. Nearly 35 students of Loyola College participated in the program, and put their heart and soul to make the program a successful one. They purchased minor provisions, for such as Junior Horlicks, Nutrition Biscuits, and kid who trays, every present during was the program.



The Doctors' advice was very useful for the parents, and the caretakers. They gave emphasis on personal hygiene, avoiding processed foods, and natural health habits. They critically were against self

- treatment given by parents to their kids.

They told that it's the fault of the parents to make a child get used to eating processed foods. Chips' packets such as Lays contains nitrogen gas, which is extremely detrimental to the health of their children. Maggi contains mono – sodium glutamate, which is harmful for our digestive



system, and warned the parents not to give any such processed foods to their kids. Instead, they insisted them to give fresh fruits, juices, boiled vegetables, etc.

Natural health habits

Doctors told the parents to encourage their children to adopt hygienic practices and to make them healthy. They were totally against brutal beating of children and being harsh with them. Rather they

advised their parents to be kind and cautious towards their kids.

The health and sanitation team members bought the Nilavembu Kasayam powder and gave it to the Amma Unavagam staffs who were working at Saidapet and they prepared the kasayam which was later distributed to the people. Once the Kasayam was prepared it was distributed to the people in the outreach intervention areas. (Children, women, men, elderly people and disabled).













When the Kasayam drink was distributed to the people one of the shop keepers came forward to help the students by giving a packet of sweets (small chocolate) as the Kasayam had a bitter taste. The Nilavembu Kasayam drink was distributed to atleast 400 people in the intervention areas and the people thanked the students for taking such an initiative.

IMPACT ON STUDENTS: Most of the students regardless of background were completely shocked by the conditions of the slum and the plight of the people living there, during the early days. They came together under one banner called Loyola college Students and worked hard to help and connect with the people there. Most of them felt that they had changed at least a bit of their personality and they felt more appreciative of what they had, they felt more positive after helping out in the slums. Some were even willing to come on Non outreach days to just come to the slum area to help and connect with the people.

IMPACT ON SLUM DWELLERS: The people there were actually kind and would openly talk with our class students. After we helped around and spent time there, they started treating us in a friendlier manner. In the slum they have known key leaders, community leaders, fans club leaders, youth group leader and self help group members, Corporation officials, health inspector, sanitary inspector, police station, head master of school and Non-governmental organization working in the slum The students were divided into 5 teams based on the community interventions. The groups are school teaching team, youth development, empowerment, caring of elders and differently abled and health and sanitation and clean environment. Students made resource mapping which have observed in the slum and identified the areas of concern for the implementation (Urban challenges). Students understood the importance of service Learning and serving the urban poor and needy. They also observed the structure of slum, types of slum and their socio-economic conditions, living conditions, educational status, health issues, environmental issues, lacing of toilet facilities, drinking water availabilities, lighting facilities, road facilities and drainage and the life condition of a family situation in the slum. Students were observed the challenges of deprived basic needs in slums.

Students established rapport with the community/stakeholders and partners in Development, Networking with NGOs-Civil Society Organizations-CBOs and Government Departments, Chennai Corporation, Tamil Nadu Slum Clearance Board, Social Defence, Taluk office, Social welfare board, nationalized banks, Women Development Corporation, Formation of teams, Tapping the government schemes and other departments.


